Strong Ales

The American Homebrewers Association includes two styles of beer in the English- and Scottish-Style Strong Ale category. The first is the rather verbose *English-Style Old Ale/English-Style Strong Ale*, and the second is *Strong Scotch Ale*.

The English Old Ale/Strong Ale is a varied collection of beers. In general, old ales are weaker versions of a barley wine, the strongest of all English-style beers. However, there is some disagreement as to whether some classic English ales are barley wines or old ales. Michael Jackson lists the following beers as old ales: Theakston's Old Peculier, Thomas Hardy's Ale, and the ever-popular Old Jock. Old Peculier is frequently regarded as the quintessential old ale. Other beer connoisseurs consider Thomas Hardy's ale as a barley wine. Perhaps the most interesting old ale is Robinwood Brewery's Old Fart. The AHA allows a very wide range for starting gravity for old ales, ranging from 1.055 to 1.125. Finishing gravities may range from 1.010 to 1.040, also extremely wide.

While the boundary between old ale and barley wines is fuzzy on the English side of the border, on the Scottish side there is a big gap between *Scotch* ales and *Scottish* ales. Scotch ales are substantially stronger than Scottish ales, at least according to the AHA style guidelines. Michael Jackson doesn't use the Scotch ale distinction, but instead considers all as Scottish ales. In his descriptions, the four Scottish ale categories are 60/-, 70/-, 80/-. And 90/- (where /- means "shilling"). The 60/-, 70/-, and 80/- designations correspond to the AHA's Scottish ales (gravities ranging from 1.030 to 1.043), while the 90/- ale has a gravity ranging from 1.050 to 1.080 (according to Jackson). The AHA looks for a higher starting gravity (1.072 to 1.085).

Both English old ale and Scotch ale malty and full-bodied. There is only low hop bitterness and little if any hop flavor and aroma. As traditional English ales, there is a definite fruity, estery character associated with the ale fermentation temperatures. The colors range from deep copper to brown.

The meeting drew one of the largest crowds in recent history, much to the surprise of our new host, Callahan's, and us. Unfortunately, the attendance exceeded the capacity of our designated area. (We hope to avoid this problem in the future.) Guests included Greg DiStefano, Tyce Heldenbrand, Tom Muehl, Dirk Niemeyer, David (?), Terry (Johnes, I think!), and Tony (?).

The medals for the Fifth America's Finest City Homebrew Competition were handed out to the QUAFF members in attendance. In total, we walked away with 28 of the competitions 77 medals. This is very impressive in that we won 36% of the medals with 27% of the total entries. A number of award-winning guests joined the meeting.

New member Dirk Niemeyer brought a gift. He has collected a wide variety of brewing software, computer files, and other assorted computer tools available in the public domain. He handed out 30 disks for eager members. This will play well into the May meeting (recipe formulation).

Dion Hollenbeck brought in his impressive arsenal of homebrewing gadgets. (This caused Skip Virgilio to comment two weeks later that "Dion has gadgets to solve problems that I never realized I had!") Randy Barnes followed with his collection of gadgets, most of which were different than Dion's. Randy's presentation might have been "99 Exciting Uses for Bilge Pumps in Homebrewing."

The February Beverage List

Due to the packed conditions at Callahan's, the extended length of the meeting, and the collection of AFCHBC beers brought in, we didn't have a formal tasting of homebrews in March. Hopefully we'll get back to this in April.

Brewing To-Do List

- Your entry in the Classic Pilsener Club-Only Competition should be aging right now. Entries should be turned in either at the next meeting on April 21 at Callahan's or at the Board meeting on May 5 at San Diego Brewing. This category includes German-Style Pilsener, Bohemian-Style Pilsener, and American-Style Pilsener.
- We want plenty of beer to take to the Temecula festival on May 2 at Lake Skinner. Now is the time to brew for Temecula.
- The Del Mar Fair Homemade Beer contest should be sometime around the end of June or early July. Be sure to have some entries so that QUAFF can have another good showing.

Club-Only Contests

Classic Pilsener

Classic Pilsener is the May Club-Only competition. Entries will be judged at the May 5 Board meeting. Bring your entries to the upcoming QUAFF meeting on April 21 at Callahan's or to the May 5 Board meeting no later than 6:30! The eligible styles for this contest are Bohemian-Style Pilsener, German-Style Pilsener, and American (Pre-Prohibition) Pilsener.

Weiss is Nice

The August Club-Only Competition is Weiss is Nice. This contest covers German-Style Wheat Beers, including Berliner Weisse, Weizen, Dunkelweizen, and Weizenbock. The timing is ideal, since wheat beers are the classic summer style. Now is the time to start brewing your entries. Be industrious and brew all four styles.

This is the final event for the first annual QUAFF Club-Only Competition. First, second, and third-place ribbons will be awarded to the top three point finishers. Also, honorable mentions will be bestowed on brewers (and brewing teams) who earn 8 points or more through all six competitions. Even if you haven't entered yet, it's still possible to get an honorable mention with a single entry that is chosen as QUAFF's representative to the Weiss is Nice, and ends up placing in the top three in the Club-Only Competition. (Remember that David Adkins took first place last year in the Extract Extravaganza with his IPA that was really supposed to be an amber ale.)

You can be sure that with Harold Gulbransen, Greg and Liz Lorton, Peter Zien, and Tod Fitzsimmons all within reach of the coveted QUAFF title, that the competition will be intense, and perhaps even cutthroat. Don't leave your fermenters unguarded.

Club-Only Contests (continued)

Points are awarded for each Club-Only contest as follows:

- Each entrant receives 1 point per entry.
- For finishing third, the entrant receives 1 additional point.
- For finishing second, the entrant receives 2 additional points.
- For finishing first, the entrant receives 3 additional points.
- The first place entrant also receives 1 point for advancing to the national Club-Only competition.
- For third place in the national Club-Only competition, the entrant receives 3 additional points.
- For second place in the national Club-Only competition, the entrant receives 4 additional points.
- For first place in the national Club-Only competition, the entrant receives 5 additional points.

Based on this system, an entrant who beer is selected to represent QUAFF in a competition will earn 5 points. If that beer wins the Club-Only competition, he or she will earn a total of 10 points. This system encourages multiple entries. An entrant may only one enter one beer per subcategory, however.

Southern California Homebrewers Festival – Lake Skinner Update (also known as "Temecula")

The Eighth Annual Southern California Homebrewers Festival on Saturday, May 2 is fast approaching. For the third year, the festival will be held at Lake Skinner.

Tickets are \$25 prepaid or \$40 at the door. QUAFF members are strongly encouraged to by tickets from Garth Jones as soon as possible. As of April 7, half of QUAFF allotment of 60 tickets had been sold. The last chance to buy tickets from Garth will be at the April meeting, so be sure to bring your check for \$25 per ticket to the meeting. Friends are welcome. The ticket price includes parking and shuttle service (if you stay at one of the designated Temecula motels or camping area), commemorative beer glass, and hundreds of homebrewed beers, renowned beer authorities, live entertainment, and the famous raffle.

Each homebrew club is asked to bring 50 gallons of beer. If you are interested in bringing beer, contact Tod Fitzsimmons. As always, we want members to bring as many beers as possible. QUAFF will have a multiple tap system on hand to serve from kegs. Members with CO₂ cylinders are asked to bring one.

Tod Fitzsimmons is encouraging all QUAFFsters to wear their QUAFF T-shirts to Temecula. If you need a T-shirt (or a few more), we will have them for sale for \$10 at the April meeting.

Del Mar Fair

The mailings have gone out for the Del Mar Fair Home Brew Contest. The contest will be held on Sunday, June 28, beginning at noon in the Paddock Stage Area (where it's been held the last few years). As usual, your entries will get you into the Fair for free. Professional brewers are not allowed to enter. Entry forms are due June 12 to the Del Mar Fair Entry Department, along with a \$5.00 processing fee (\$5.00 per entrant, not per entry). To obtain a Homebrew Contest brochure with entry form, send a self-addressed, stamped legal-size envelope to Home Brew Contest, Del Mar Fair Entry Office, P.O. Box 2663, Del Mar, CA 92014.

Again this year, the entry styles sort of follow the AHA styles, but with a few big exceptions. American Pale Ale is a single category and American Wheat is a single category. There is no American Amber category. (In the AHA, these three styles are all in the American-Style Ale category.) Each of the AHA's five stout subcategories is an single category for Del Mar.
