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QUAFF Storms Through AHA Southwest Regional

In 1999, QUAFF made its best ever performance in the first round regional of the National Homebrew Competition (NHC), sponsored by the American Homebrewers Association. That year we won 12 ribbons (1 first, 5 seconds, and 6 thirds) and amassed 27 points (based on 6 points for a first, 3 points for a second, and 1 point for a third). Points earned in the first and second rounds of the NHC and the club-only competitions are totaled by AHA to determine their homebrew club of the year. Last year, the Capitol Brewers of Oregon and the Urban Knaves of Grain of Illinois tied for first with a total of 77 points.

This year, QUAFF made a strong statement that we want the title in San Diego for 2000. In the first round Southwest regional alone, QUAFF collected 24 ribbons (8 firsts, 9 seconds, and 7 thirds), and accumulated 82 points. And these are only preliminary results, since one category (Specialty, Experimental, Historical Beers) remains to be judged, and also monster brewer Tyce Heldenbrand's beers have not yet been judged in Philadelphia (at press time). In addition, adding another point for Greg and Liz Lorton's third place finish in the national Club-Only competition for lambics in April, QUAFF now has 83 points and (hopefully) counting.

QUAFF hosted its first ever AHA NHC regional competition from April 22 through May 8. Tyce Heldenbrand was the official organizer, although because of a field assignment in Philadelphia, much of his work was long distance, and a lot of work was delegated to other QUAFF Board members, including Tod Fitzsimmons, Harold Gulbransen, Peter Zien, Randy Barnes, and Greg Lorton.

The Southwest Regional Competition was open to homebrewers from California, Arizona, Nevada, Utah, and Hawaii. The regional drew 457 entries, mostly from California, but quite a few also from Arizona. 28 categories were contested. The Southwest Regional is one of seven (six in the U.S. and one in Canada). The top three finishers from each category in each region advances to the second round judging at the AHA National Conference in Livonia, Michigan. The AHA has minimum score requirements for a beer to advance to the second round, so it is conceivable that some categories in a region may not advance three entries. Therefore, each category can have up to 21 entries in the second round.

Rich Link and Bob Whritner gave the feature presentation, which was a recap of their trip last year to Belgium and Germany. Along with MaryJo Whritner and Teresa Link, the dynamic duo embarked on a crusade across two of the most renowned beer countries in the world. Bob took a digital camera, and the four of them managed to document most of the trip, including beer highlights. The presentation featured overheads made from the photographs. It looked like the Links and Whritners had a good time! In addition to the presentation, a number of classic Belgian beers were sampled, including Westmalle Dubbel, Grimbergen Double and Triple, DeDolle Brewers' Oerbier, and Rodenbach Alexander.

These points do not include the results of the Specialty, Experimental, Historical Beer category (in which there were several QUAFF entries), and the results of Tyce Heldenbrand's entries in Philadelphia. (As organizer of the the Southwest Regional, Tyce was not allowed to enter beers in that region. So he chose to enter them in the region that he is currently working in, the Northeast Regional.)

With the AHA's scoring system of six point for a first, three for a second, and one for a third, QUAFF scored points than the next six highest scoring clubs combined. Peter Zien's 31 points were more than twice as many as any other club or individual. (Bob Thompson of the Temecula Valley Homebrewers scored all 15 of the TVHA's points, with six awards.) Our friends, the Brew Techs, amassed 10 points (Greg Distefano had a first and a third, and Dave Askey had a second.)

Club-Only Contests

Lambic

The national Club-Only competition for lambics was held on April 1 in Illinois, and Greg and Liz Lorton took third place overall. First place went to Douglas Faynor of Woodburn, Oregon, and second to Mark Gaspard of Kansas City, Missouri. A total of 23 entries were received.

Weiss is Nice

The Weiss is Nice Club-Only competition will be held in mid May in Louisiana. QUAFF entries are already due in, but the winning QUAFF representative has not yet been selected. The contest covers the four German wheat styles: Bavarian Weizen, Bavarian Dunkelweizen, Berliner Weisse, and Weizenbock.)

Best of Big Brew

The Best of Big Brew Club-Only competition is designed to feature the beers brewed in the National Homebrew Day (May 6) Big Brew. Since this beer is an American pale ale, the Club-Only competition focuses only on American pale ales (category 6a in the new AHA/BJCP guidelines), and not the other subcategories (American amber ale and California common ale). The contest is scheduled for the end of August and will be hosted by the Cross Street Irregulars.

Best of Fest

The Best of Fest Club-Only competition features German amber lagers, Oktoberfest and Märzen (AHA/BJCP categories 9a and 9b). The competition is in mid-October, and is sponsored by the Minnesota Timberworts.

Historical Beers

Finally, 2000 will wind up with Historical Beers in early December, hosted by the High Plains Draughters (Oklahoma). This contest will cover on the historical beers of the Specialty/Experimental/Historical Beer category.

Local Beer News

San Diego Real Ale Festival

Pizza Port in Carlsbad will host the 3rd Annual San Diego Real Ale Festival on Friday, May 12, and Saturday, May 13. Festivities will begin on Friday at 4:00 PM and Saturday at 11:00 AM, and will continue each day until closing. Forty firkins are expected of cask-conditioned ales are expected. Be warned however, that when each cask is done that's it, there are no more!

The festival will be held adjacent to Pizza Port Carlsbad, which is located at 572 Carlsbad Village Drive in downtown Carlsbad, about ½ mile west of I-5. The entry price of \$10.00 gets you a logo English pint glass, five taster tickets (5 ounces each), and a program to guide you through all of the beers. Each additional taster ticket is \$1.00 each. Raffle tickets are \$1.00 each or 6 for \$5.00. Festival T-shirts are \$10.00.

Temecula Festival

The Tenth Annual Southern California Homebrew Festival (SCHF X) has come and gone, another rousing success. The festival continues to be great, this time under the supervision of festival president Rich Link. The feature speakers were George Fix and Alan Sprints (Hair of the Dog Brewery). And the raffle, hosted by Teresa Link, continues to grow is size.

After a slow start in the morning, QUAFF managed to crank up an impressive selection of beers. Short of CO_2 for an hour and a half, the selection included an IPA from Leonard Ackerman, and ESBs from Rich and Teresa Link and Joe Buchan. Once the CO_2 showed up, more beers hit the taps, including beers from Greg and Liz Lorton, Peter Zien, more from Rich Link, Randy Barnes, Jeff Majors, Harold Gottschalk, and several others (forgive me for not writing them all down.

Del Mar Fair Home Brew Contest

One of the largest (if not the largest) homebrew competitions in California is the Del Mar Fair. To enter the contest, you must submit an entry form by no later than 5:00 PM on Friday, June 9. Entry forms may be obtained from the Del Mar Fair Entry Office, 2260 Jimmy Durante Boulevard, Del Mar 92014-2216. The entry fee is \$5.00 per entrant (not per entry), so \$5.00 gets you into the contest, no matter how many beers you bring. Also, you entries allow you free entry into the fair. (Just tell the admission people that you are bringing entries for the Home Brew Contest.) In the last several years, the Home Brew contest has been the largest arts and crafts contest in the fair.

There are 5 divisions, and 33 categories. Ribbons are awarded to the top five beers in each category (if merited by the judges). Also ribbons are awarded to the winners of each division. The first place winner in each category also wins a \$10 gift certificate to Home Brew Mart, and awards from Karl Strauss Brewery and Stone Brewing. The winner of each division also wins a \$25 gift certificate to Beer & Wine Crafts, another award from Stone Brewing, and a special trophy from Karl Strauss. The Sweepstakes Winner is selected from the five division winners, and represents the Best of Show. The Sweepstakes Winner wins another \$25 gift certificate from Beer & Wine Crafts, a \$25 gift certificate from Home Brew Mart, a double magnum of ale from Stone Brewing, and a special trophy from Karl Strauss Brewery.
