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Anchor Rules!!!

Amid whistles, whoops, and chants of "QUAFF rules!", QUAFF was awarded custody of the California Homebrew Club of the Year Trophy at Anchor Brewing Company in San Francisco. The award culminated a festive dinner put on by the employees of Anchor Brewing. The event was the largest assemblage of QUAFF members and the largest collection of QUAFF Board members at one time. It turned out to be a pilgrimage to the beer-making mecca that the majority of the members would not pass up.

Dinner featured steaks and chicken, corn on the cob, and salad. I haven't had such a good steak in at least three years. The food was prepared and served by Anchor employees. Beverages included Anchor Steam Beer, Liberty Ale, Anchor Porter, Old Foghorn (Yes, I know, BobW! ☺), Wheat, and Small Beer.

As a brewery, Anchor is a work of art. Attendees were enthralled with the copper mash tun, lauter tun, and brew kettle; the open-tank primary fermenters, and the collection of hops visible on the floor on which the party was held.

Following an hour and a half of socializing and then the dinner, the awards ceremony was held. The ceremony began with awards to Peter Zien and Harold Gulbransen. Peter and Harold each took two firsts, a second, and a third at the California State Homebrew Competition in San Francisco last November. They received ribbons, plus specially engraved glass steins for their first place beers. Peter and Harold's accomplishments set QUAFF up to take the California Homebrew Club of the Year Award.

After Peter and Harold's awards were handed out, the party was "serenaded" with a song by Tom Dalldorf, publisher of Celebrator Beer News.

Finally, Bruce Joseph of Anchor presided over the award of the California State Homebrew Club of the Year trophy to Peter Zien. The trophy was fabricated by the late coppersmith of Anchor's brewery, and includes the names of all of the winning clubs, finishing with QUAFF for 2000! The trophy is topped with a copper stein that was filled with Anchor beer. Peter Zien followed the tradition of quaffing the beer, and invited Greg Lorton (QUAFF essayist) and Harold Gulbransen to also partake.

Our appreciation goes to Bruce Joseph and the entire Anchor team. This event no doubt qualifies as the best QUAFF event of all time! Show your support and buy a six-pack (or more) of Anchor beers! ☺

QUAFF Goals (continued)

In last month's newsletter, I summarized the tremendous success that we achieved together as a club in 2000. I also asked for your earnest commitment toward attaining the distinction of AHA National Homebrew Club of the Year. I am extremely confident that we will make a great run together to attain this tremendous honor.

Another important goal of the club is to repeat as Anchor Brewing Company's choice for California Homebrew Club of the Year. Many of the past winning clubs have repeated during their reigns and I'm sure that you will realize the importance of this after experiencing the Anchor party earlier this month. By the time you read this, we will have shared in a glorious evening celebrating what a group can achieve when talent and commitment become one. How can we repeat as California Homebrew Club of the Year? Anchor Brewing Company has developed a unique method for choosing the winner each year. Basically, it is a two part equation involving a homebrew competition and an essay. The following is a list of ways in which you can help QUAFF repeat as the California champions:

1. Enter the California State Homebrew Competition (CSHC) - The CSHC is held annually in November. The rules and categories are unique, so you'll need to read them carefully. You may enter individually representing the club or through the entity of the club, which may submit entries as well. If you enter as an individual, you must have won a 1st place in a formally organized competition in California in the previous year for each entry to the CSHC (AHA Nationals excluded). Also, the awards are based on a percentage of the total entries in a given category. In other words, more than one 1st, 2nd, or 3rd may be awarded in each category depending on the number of entries.

2. Provide suggestions for new Club events - The essay portion of the California Homebrew Club of the Year award is very important. In the essay, we enumerate the various activities and events that make our club the best. Although we manage to fill our calendar with many beer-related activities, we are always looking for new things to do. Input from our membership is always encouraged. Do you have an idea for something new? Attend a board meeting or share your idea with a board member and get involved.

3. Participate in Club events - The enthusiasm of the club is largely measured by our participation in the varied events throughout the year. It is not enough that we conduct these events- it wouldn't mean much if only a few participated. Show your enthusiasm by attending the contests, parties, campouts, sporting events, festivals, pub crawls, etc.. You can even go a step further by volunteering your time to help

organize and assist with the club events. We always need and welcome help from the general membership.

4. Contribute to the Newsletter - A great way to really learn about a beer style or a brewing procedure is to do some research and write an article. By doing so, you will have increased your own brewing knowledge, as well as the readers of the newsletter. Or have you run across an interesting beer-related news item that you would like to share with the club? Either way, our newsletter editor is always looking for interesting contributions.

In conclusion, Quaff has many things on the "to do" list for 2001. Last year was just a sampling of what our club can accomplish with a little well-directed effort. The up-side to this is that what we do together as a club is FUN! It should never feel like a duty (that's what work is for) to help the club succeed. Our enthusiasm and love for the craft will take us down the path to success naturally. So relax, have a homebrew, and focus on helping Quaff continue its climb to the top of the homebrewing world!

Keeping the Contests and Awards Straight

It has been brought to my attention that the list of contests and corresponding initials has become somewhat confusing. This quick reference list should help to keep it all straight!

Bi-Monthly National Club-Only Contests - The American Homebrewers Association (AHA) sponsors these contests that showcase a particular style category every other month. Only one entry per registered Homebrew Club is allowed, so Quaff conducts a mini-contest to determine who will represent our club at the National level. The National Club-Only Contest is one factor used by the AHA to determine the **National Homebrew Club of the Year**. Check the newsletter for upcoming club-only styles and contest dates.

8th Annual America's Finest City Homebrew Competition (AFCHBC) - This event is sponsored by Quaff every year, usually during the first weekend of March. You are encouraged to enter homebrews, judge, and steward to help the club with its primary source of money for the treasury. The AFCHBC is not connected with any other award or title. See (www.softbrew.com/afchbc) for more on this year's competition.

The AHA National Homebrew Competition (AHA NHC) This AHA sponsored event is held every year and consists of 2 rounds of competition. The **First Round** will be held on April 27 & 28, 2001 and Quaff has been chosen to conduct this stage of the competition for the California region. If your entry places in the First Round, then it advances to the Second Round. The **Second Round** will be held at the **AHA Homebrewer's Conference** in Los Angeles on June 21-23, 2001. The First and Second Rounds, along with the National Club-Only results (see above), are used to determine the **National Homebrew Club of the Year**.

The California State Homebrew Competition (CSHC) - This annual event is sponsored by the San Andreas Malts

Homebrew Club, usually during the first week of November. It features it's own special rules and style categories. The results of this contest, along with an essay about the club, are used to determine **Anchor Brewing Company's California Homebrew Club of the Year**. See this month's article for more information on the CSHC.

Dunkelmania

The Dunkelmania deadline has passed, but the results aren't in yet. They will be listed as soon as judging is complete.

Stout

The Stout Club-Only competition follows quickly on the heels of the Dunkelmania. QUAFF's entrant will be selected as the highest scoring QUAFF entrant at the 8th Annual America's Finest City Homebrew Competition. This includes the dry stout, sweet stout, oatmeal stout, and foreign stout styles of Category 16 (Stouts), plus Russian Imperial Stout (Category 12c).

QUAFF Brews

Leaching off of Rich's creativity, we will include a special recipe from a QUAFF brewer each month. To start this, we feature...

Rich Link's Belgian Dubbel

As many of you know, I'm a big fan of Belgian style beers. During our most recent visit to Belgium, one beer that we sampled more than most was Westmalle Dubbel. This beer has great caramel and candy flavors that are balanced very nicely with adequate hop bitterness.

Upon return from Belgium, the first beer that I brewed was a beer to emulate Westmalle's famous dubbel. Also, since I am able to mash enough malt for 10 gallons of wort, I took half of the wort and spiced it to make a spiced dubbel.

For 5 Gallons:

11 lbs Pale Malt 0.5 oz Northern Brewer Hops @ 8.8 AA
1 lb Crystal 70 0.5 oz East Kent Goldings Hops @ 5.1 AA
2 oz Chocolate Malt

Mash at 152 F for one hour. Sparge to collect 6.5 gallons.

In kettle add:

2 lbs Dark Candi Sugar

Boil for one hour. Chill to pitching temperature and add White Labs Trappist or Abbey Ale yeast.

Original Gravity 1.076 - 1.082

Final Gravity 1.012 - 1.016

Spiced Option

0.25 oz Coriander

0.125 oz Curacao

0.25 oz Cardamom

Add these for the last ten minutes of the boil.
