Fifth Annual America's Finest City Homebrew Competition Update

1997 (not 1998) Style Guidelines To Be Used

When we started organizing for the Fifth Annual AFCHBC, we expected that the American Homebrewers Association would publish the 1998 National Homebrew Competition Style Guidelines in the Winter 1997 Zymurgy. In this way, the style guidelines would have been readily available to most entrants. However, as of New Year's, the AHA hasn't yet published the NHC Style Guidelines, and you have to mail away to AHA to get them anyway. Therefore, we made the decision to go with the 1997 Style Guidelines, published in the Winter 1996 Zymurgy.

Entry Packets Now Available

Now that we have decided to go with the 1997 Guidelines, entry packets should now be available at the seven homebrew supply shops listed on page 5. Look for the display boxes. We will also have entry packets at the January and February meetings, and your friendly board members should have some. The entry packet includes the contest rules and information, list of contest style categories and sub-categories (1997 styles), bottle label form, and entry form. Expected 1998 NHC Style Changes

Although the AHA has not officially published the 1998 National Homebrew Competition Style Guidelines, Amahl Turczyn of the AHA has summarized the changes, which only seem to be minor changes from the 1997 Style Guidelines. According to Amahl, the major highlights are:

- New category names for location-specific beer styles like Bock. These will be "German-Style Bock," etc
- Expanded Belgian-Style Ale sub-categories. For example, instead of just Belgian-Style Strong Ale, there are now a strong light and strong dark sub-categories.
- Higher upper end and revamped descriptions for German-Style Kölsch and English-Style Ale/Old Ale.

1st Annual San Diego Strong Ale Fest a Success!

Over 250 people showed up on a rainy Thursday night at Pizza Port Carlsbad for the 1st Annual San Diego Strong Ale Festival. The event featured 12 local beers each containing at least 8% alcohol by volume. The favorite offering of the evening was AleSmith's J.P. Gray's Wee Heavy, a scotch ale served on a beer engine from a traditional English Firkin. AleSmith won both the People's Choice and Brewer's Choice awards. Stone Brewing Company was second in the People's Choice with Turbo Arrogant Bastard Ale, San Diego Brewing Company was third for its Red Star Stout and Ballast Point Brewing Company got an honorable mention for its Navigator Barley Wine. Santa's Little Helper Imperial Stout from Pizza Port Solana Beach was runner-up for the Brewer's Choice award.

In addition to the great beer, owner Vince Marsaglia made a special smoked bratwurst, red cabbage, sauerkraut, and mustard pizza on a whole-grain beer crust. There was also a raffle featuring prizes donated by all of the participating breweries. The festival was enjoyed by all who came, and no one got out of hand. A good night of drinking good beer. MASH Homebrew Competition

The MArin Society of Homebrewers (MASH) will hold their 1998 Homebrew Competition on Saturday, February 21. The entry fee is \$6.00 per entry, payable to MASH (checks only, no cash!) The entry deadline is 5:00, February 7, and should be shipped to Oak Barrel Winecraft, 1443 San Pablo Avenue, Berkeley, CA 94702-1799. Three bottles (10-oz or larger) are needed for each entry. (Smaller 6- or 7-oz bottles may be entered for barley wines.)

Awards will include first, second, and third place ribbons in each beer style category, subject to the decision of the judges. Best of Show ribbons will be awarded for the best all-grain beer and the best extract beer. Other prizes donated by sponsors will also be given.

Sierra Nevada Homebrewer of the Year

Are you seeking greater glory for your brewing efforts? Why not consider the Sierra Nevada Homebrewer of the Year (SNHotY) award, the top award for California amateur brewers? The award is made in November, but if you are interested, now is the time to start planning. The following information was taken from the SNHotY web page.

Details of the Award

Goal: To recognize a leading California amateur brewer who has demonstrated his/her abilities by accumulating the most award points in three specific competitions in California.

The competitions include:

- Maltose Falcons' Mayfaire competition, normally held in April or May
- California State Fair Homebrew Competition, sponsored by the Gold county Brewers, normally held in August.
- California State Homebrew Competition, sponsored by the San Andreas Malts, normally held in November.

Prizes: The winner will have his or her name added to a permanent trophy which will be on display at the Sierra Nevada Brewery and receive a commemorative trophy to take home. The winner will be invited to spend a day brewing with the staff at Sierra Nevada. Also a \$500 stipend will be presented to the winner to be used as he or she chooses to advance his or her brewing skills.

Presentation Date: The winner will be named at the California State Homebrew Competition, held in November.

Sponsor: The award will be sponsored by the Sierra Nevada Brewing Company.

Administration: The award will be administered by the San Andreas Malts.

Rules

The award is open to all amateur brewers within the state of California. An amateur brewer is anyone not directly involved in a commercial brewing process, either as an owner, employee, or consultant.

All entrants in the Maltose Falcons' Mayfaire competition, the California State Fair Homebrew Competition, or the California State Homebrew Competition who meet the above criteria will automatically be considered for this award. Points will be awarded to them for each of the entries which fall in the top three scoring positions of each entry category in any of these competitions. The brewer who accumulates the most total points from the combined results of these three competitions will win the award. Brewing teams are considered unique entrants and so any points awarded to such teams will only count toward the team's standing. Points may not be divided between brewers on a team. Individual brewers who tie within the top three scoring positions for a category will get points

according to their score's position. For example, if there is a tie for second place and both entries have an equal numeric score, both will receive points for the "second highest score" according to the schedule described in the section "Awarding Points".

Results of the California State Fair Homebrew Competition and the Maltose Falcons' Mayfaire competition will be tallied with the California State Homebrew Competition on the day of that event so that the winner can be announced at that time.

Awarding Points

Points will be awarded as follows:

for categories which have 14 or fewer entries:

- Top score: 6 points
- Second highest score: 3 points
- Third highest score: 1 point

for categories which have greater than 14 entries:

an amount equal to 1% of the total number of entries in that category will be added to the above point schedule. For example, a top score winner in a category with 36 entries would be worth 6.36 points. A second highest score in the same category would be worth 3.36 points.

Best of Show winners will receive additional points equal to 1% of the total entries in the competition in which the BOS awarded. Example: an IPA takes the Best of Show at the California State Fair after winning First Place in the Pale Ale category. If the State Fair attracts 350 total entries, and the Pale Ale had 45 entries, the Best of Show winner would get 9.95 points (6.45 points for winning First Place in a category with 45 entries, plus 3.5 points for taking the BOS in a competition with 350 entries).

Determining the Winner

The winner will be determined by the highest total accumulated points from the combined competition results. In case of a numerical tie, the winner will be that brewer in the tie who has the most total awards. Should this not settle the tie, the brewer in the tie with the greater number of higher point awards will win. Should this still not resolve the tie, a representative of Sierra Nevada shall decide the winner.
